They have shown great enthusiasm, resilience and positivity throughout the week, and it has been a real pleasure to have them back in the classrooms.

We are now looking ahead to next week and hope to welcome even more pupils from across the EYFS and Year 1 back into school. Having this information in advance allows us to ensure that all safety procedures, registers and classroom arrangements are in place.

For those pupils who continue to learn online, we would like to say a huge well done. We are incredibly proud of the way you have adapted to a different way of learning, and of your continued effort, engagement and commitment. You remain very much a valued part of our school community, and we are pleased with how well you are continuing to progress.

We are also pleased to share an update regarding Arabic provision. From Sunday, Arabic A lessons will be embedded directly into pupils' calendars, in the same way as their class teacher lessons. These sessions will take place in smaller groups with pupils' usual Arabic teacher, allowing for greater consistency and a more personalised learning experience. Rather than taking place at the end of the day, these lessons will now be scheduled throughout the morning.

While Arabic A lessons are taking place, Arabic B pupils will access pre-recorded lessons. Following this, they will continue their learning with their class teachers as normal.

As a next step, we will also begin to introduce Assignments for Arabic lessons in the days ahead, allowing pupils to submit their work directly and receive more focused feedback from their teachers.
